Project Spotlight: SR 710

In November 2012, Johnson-Davis began work on the SR710 project, located in Riviera Beach, Florida, as a subcontractor to Ranger Construction Industries for the Florida Department of Transportation. The overall project consists of widening 0.82 miles of Martin Luther King Boulevard from Congress Avenue east to

Australian Boulevard, including improvements north on Congress Avenue. The project is estimated to be complete in the Spring of 2014.

Johnson-Davis's scope of work consists of gravity sanitary sewer, water main, and drainage improvements. Work began on Martin Luther King

Boulevard with installation of the 12" water main and was soon accompanied by the installation of over 1,200 linear feet of 58"x91" elliptical reinforced concrete pipe and

the associated massive drainage manholes and inlets. Work then opened up on Avenue O, Congress Avenue, Avenue S, Avenue N, and Avenue P. Commonly referred to as "Candy Land" by Superintendent Joe Bagford due to the vast

amount of underground work available, the project became a work place for multiple Johnson-Davis crews, sometimes as many as five crews simultaneously.

This section of SR710 provides direct access to the Port of Palm Beach which is the fourth busiest port in Florida and the twenty-first largest in container throughput according to the American Association of Port Authorities.

Because of the Port traffic, there were restrictions to lane closures

during the day and therefore night work was required for all of the util-

ity road crossings performed by open cut. However, with project team coordination and cooperation it was determined

that a large section of deep gravity sanitary sewer, storm drainage and water main work could be completed under a brief road closure required by the FEC to reconstruct their railroad crossing within the project. Combining four Johnson-Davis crews who committed to working both Saturday and Sunday,

nine road crossings including over 400 linear feet of gravity sanitary sewer removal and replacement were completed during daytime operations. This coordinated effort provided a

safer environment for our employees and saved both time and money as it eliminated multiple nights of work that would have required sin-

gle lane road closures and restricted productions. Congratulations and thank you to all of those who contributed and participated.

Existing utilities throughout the SR710 project created the need for multiple

conflict structures to accommodate both old and new utilities. Existing drainage systems had to be isolated from the

new drainage system, existing gravity sanitary sewer had to pass through the new drainage system, and existing water mains had to pass through the new drainage system. Many of these conflicts involved large diameter pipes and therefore were designed by the engineer as cast-in-place structures. By performing field investigations and determining actual elevations of existing utilities prior to commencing, Johnson-Davis was able have these structures precast with the help of Concrete Products of the Palm Beaches. Structures were constructed such that the bases with minimal walls fit beneath the existing utilities and dog-

house riser sections were set above them. Most of the conflict structures also included steel casings to provide a barrier and protect the two different utilities from leaking into one another. Many of these steel casings had to be split and fabricated to allow them to be bolted back together around the existing utilities in the field. Fabrication of all the split casings was performed by Johnson-Davis's shop personnel.

With the water main work complete and Ranger's Phase 1 roadwork nearing completion, the project is about 75% complete for Johnson-Davis. Though the majority of work is complete and most of the major drainage installed, Phase 2 of the project will involve a significant amount of gravity sanitary sewer removal and replacement that brings with it some new challenges such as confined space work in live sanitary sewers and maintaining the existing sewer flows with the use of floats and bypass

pumping while performing our work.

To date the SR710 project has progressed well and is currently on track to be another successful project for Johnson-Davis.

Continue to prepare, plan, produce, and most importantly, be safe. Keep up the good work.


25 YEARS OF SERVICE


MICHAEL PETTY**5 YEARS OF SERVICE**

DILLARD THOMAS WINKLER**5 YEARS OF SERVICE**



pediatrician. She wants to be fluent in Spanish so she can serve both English and Spanish speaking patients, and as such is also working towards a foreign language citation in Spanish.



In addition to being a full-time student and volunteering in the community, Olinpia also is a full-time employee. She works for a criminal defense attorney and supports all aspects of the practice.






